After spending 20 years living abroad with her Foreign Service husband, Ms. Greene returned to the Washington area in 1986 and devoted herself to the partnership between the Smith College Club of Washington and the inner city Ketcham Elementary School in Southeast. She and her volunteers spent countless hours tutoring, reading aloud in the classrooms, arranging and chaperoning trips, teaching creative writing, and mobilizing parents to participate in the school.

Other alumnae honored at the ceremony included Julia Child (another Foreign Service spouse!), Betty Friedan, and actress and author Yolanda King. Also attending were alumnae Gloria Steinem and Shelly Lazarus, chairman and CEO of Ogilvy and Mather Worldwide.
