# **AAFSW Awarded Two Exciting Grants**

#### "Foreign Service Dashboard"

Thanks to the Cox Foundation and our AAFSW development team, Foreign Service community members will soon have access to an exciting new resource: an online "dashboard" providing a clear overview of the many organizations, groups and websites that serve our community.

The site will include non-profits such as AAFSW and the Foreign Service Youth Foundation; governmental offices such as the Family Liaison Office and Transition Center; and many independent resources such as PROPS on LinkedIn and Trailing Houses on Facebook.

The team is currently developing a survey to identify what kinds of information people in the Foreign Service community are looking for online, so that the Dashboard can be developed accordingly. The survey will be sent soon to all members and shared widely. We'll also ask for members' help in identifying all of the relevant resources to be included on the Dashboard.

#### **SOSA 25th Anniversary Video**

The second successful proposal resulted in a grant for the production of a video to promote and commemorate the 25th anniversary of the Secretary of State Award for Outstanding Volunteerism Abroad (SOSA) in November, 2015.

There will be three different versions of the video, with different aims:

- (1) An approximately 30-second "mini-spot," designed to increase awareness of the SOSA awards within the Foreign Service community and to encourage people to submit volunteer nominations.
- (2) An approximately 2-minute "commercial" or promotional video, aimed at the broader public in the U.S. and around the world. This version will highlight the fascinating projects and outstanding volunteer work carried out by Foreign Service employees and family members. It will be designed to inspire people to share it with friends and family outside the Foreign Service on social media.
- (3) A longer, approximately 3-minute version, to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the award. This video will be shown on at the award ceremony in the Benjamin Franklin Room, Department of State in November, and it will also remain permanently accessible on the AAFSW website for those interested in learning more about the SOSA program.


project a clear, consistent message so that we can serve the community more effectively and attract more members and volunteers.

#### **Traditional Chinese Medicine**

AAFSW cordially invites you to discover the ancient and powerful realm of healthcare known as Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM).

Our program will take place on **Tuesday, June 23** at 11:30 a.m. at the Wildwood Acupuncture Center Academy of Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine in Bethesda, MD.



Our speakers are: Dr. Tian Xiaoming Tian, L.Ac., CMD and Dr. Christina Tian, MAOM, L.Ac., Dipl. OM, CMD, BSBA, They will present information on traditional Chinese medicine and also provide a demonstration of acupuncture treatment.

The practice of TCM has evolved over thousands of years in China and across the Asian continent, in a fascinating historical, spiritual, and cultural context. The practice is vast and includes therapies such as acupuncture and acupressure, herbal medicine, Qi Gong, and nutritional counseling, all customized to patients' personal constitutions and particular health conditions.

Today, TCM is studied, medically researched, and clinically practiced around the world to treat a wide range of acute and chronic health disorders affecting both body and mind. It represents an important aspect of integrative medicine in today's modern healthcare system and can also be effective in preventing illness by supporting a strong immune system and promoting internal balance.

Xiaoming Tian, L.Ac., CMD., is a licensed Acupuncturist, Doctor of Chinese Medicine, and Director of the Academy of Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine and Wildwood Acupuncture Center. Dr. Tian obtained his medical degree from Beijing Medical University where he specialized in sports medicine and bone pathology, and did his post-doctoral fellowship in bone pathology ultra-structure and biochemistry at both John's Hopkins Medical University and the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He has run a successful clinical practice in Bethesda, MD since

1986, and he and his associates have provided acupuncture and Chinese medicine treatments for more than 15,000 patients in the Washington, D.C. area. In 1996, Dr. Tian co-founded the Academy of Acupuncture & Chinese Medicine to develop research on Chinese herbal medicine and dietary supplements to treat and prevent osteoarthritis, osteoporosis, and sports injuries.



Also presenting will be Dr. Christina Tian, MAOM, L.Ac., Dipl. OM, CMD, BSBA, who is a licensed Acupuncturist and Doctor of Chinese Medicine. Christina is a second generation practitioner and was greatly influenced by watching her father's work with his patients and dedication to Traditional Chinese Medicine. She graduated from Boston University and received her Master's Degree in Oriental Medicine, specializing in Chinese herbal medicine and acupuncture, from the New England School of Acupuncture, the oldest acupuncture school in the United States. Christina is currently working on a book utilizing ancient Chinese nutritional therapy for modern use.




